To whom it may concern:

.....the most admirable youth Albert Christiaan van Raalte - by the royal law of 9 September 1826... - in the discipline of mathematics we attest has done cum laude work – and the most noble faculty of philosophy and letters lets him from this part to be able to be admitted to examination to be a graduate candidate at the theological school. [very rough, uncertain translation]
