The minutes of the Board of Regents of the Holland Academy reported that Rev. Albertus C. Van Raalte was among those who were in attendance. Gerrit Bolks of Milwaukee, Wisconsin, presumably the son of Rev. Seine Bolks, applied for admission.

Art. 1. At the request of the President, Rev.
H. Stobbeland opened the meeting with
prayer.

Art. 2. The minutes of the preceding meeting
were read and adopted.

Art. 3. A testimonial from the Consistory
of the Ref. A. Church of Milwaukee concerning
Gerrit Bolks, who desires to be admitted
to the School, was read. After due exami-

As his utmost in providing for the wants, connected with his son's education it was

Resolved, that we will accept him, in order to try his Education.

Act. 4. The manner of opening the Academy year was considered, when the meeting Resolved, that Mr. van de Wall address his pupils to morrow at 10 o' clock A.M. and that a meeting for prayers & address to the students be held in the afternoon in which the ministering brethren will all take part.

Act. 5. Resolved, that the organy act about which is spoken in the preceding meeting be laid on the table.

Act. 6. A Committee was appointed to compare the books of Mr. Freeman, Rev. van Rull with those of Rev. John van Fleck, and to report on the next meeting, said Committee to consist of Messrs van de Wall & Swames.

Art. 7. Rev. V. Beaulieu, v. West & v. Wall were appointed a committee to arrange the affairs of the School during the interval of the meeting.

Art. 8. The meeting was closed with prayer by
