This Indenture, Made the Twenty first day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ~~one~~ ^{sixty} SIXTY BETWEEN The Consistory of the First Reformed Protestant Dutch Church of Holland Ottawa County State of Michigan of the first part, and Albertus C. Van Raalte of Holland Ottawa Michigan of the second part,

Witnesseth, That the said parties of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of one Dollar to them in hand paid, by the said party of the second part, the receipt whereof is hereby confessed and acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold, remised, aliened and confirmed, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell, remise, release, alien and confirm, unto the said party of the second part, and to his ~~heir~~ assigns for ever, All the following

Tract or parcel of land: Situated in the county of Ottawa and State of Michigan: viz: Lot Number Seven of Block numbered forty Five of Village Holland according to the recorded map of said Village: For the purpose to be decreed by the party of the second part to the general Synod of the Reformed Protestant Dutch Church in North America.
