


"France was acting like the Jew, Shylock, in demanding the last pound of flesh [from Germany]."



"Now, O Lord... [I have] safely arrived in this place to dedicate and consecrate this land unto Thee, for the gathering together of Judah's scattered remnants."




"I believe in no other part of the world is there as good as good a feeling in the hearts of mankind towards the Jewish people as among the Latter-Day Saints" (1921).
