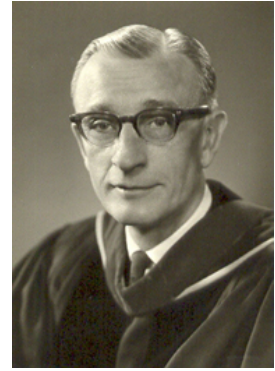

A collection of papers related to the life and work of Albertus G. Bossenbroek (1919-1997). Collection covers his family background and information from throughout his ministry in the Reformed Church of America. Over half of the collection is of his sermons. Hope College class of 1932; Western Theological Seminary class of 1936; executive secretary of the General Synod of New York, 1964-1979; president of the General Synod, 1977-1978.

### Biography

Albertus G. Bossenbroek was born on a farm in Brandon, Wisconsin, on October 16, 1910. He and his nine siblings were educated in a one-room schoolhouse. In 1936, he married Hilda Lanting. They had three daughters, Nina Kay, Margaret, and Donna Louise.

Upon finishing high school, Bossenbroek went to Hope College in Holland, Michigan. He had planned on entering the ministry, but after graduation was uncertain if this was his calling. After some time working in a grocery store, he began his studies at Western Theological Seminary in Holland. He was ordained November 16, 1936. His first congregation was at Helderberg Reformed Church, in Guilderland Center, New York. After five years there, he was called to the First Reformed Church in Chatham, New York. In 1947, he moved to Hastings-on-Hudson, where he served at the Hastings Reformed Church for seventeen years. In 1964, his career took a new turn, and he became the executive secretary of the Synod of New York. He worked in this position until being elected president of the General Synod in 1978. Bossenbroek formally retired in 1979, but continued working part-time at the New Brunswick Theological Seminary. During his career, Bossenbroek sat on numerous committees and acted as trustee to Hope College, Central College, and Western Theological Seminary.

Albertus G. Bossenbroek passed away in 1997.

### Scope and Content

Most of the collection consists of Bossenbroek's sermons. On the back of each sermon he has listed when (and sometimes where) the sermon was given. Other parts of the collection include his diplomas from Hope College and Western Theological Seminary, newsletters from churches where he worked, and correspondence from throughout his career.
