To have and to hold the same, unto the said party of the second part, his successor and assigns, for subject only to the proviso in the said Indenture of Mortgage mentioned: And I do hereby make, constitute, and appoint the said party of the second part, my true and lawful attorney, irrevocable, in my name, or otherwise, but at his proper costs and charges, to have, use, and take all lawful ways and means for the recovery of all the said money and interest; and in case of payment, to discharge the same as fully as I might or could do if these presents were not made.*
