22 December 1864

Holland, Michigan

At this meeting of the School Board of the Holland Academy, the good attendance included those of Rev. Philip Phelps Jr. and Dr. Albertus C. Van Raalte. Rev. Christian Vander Veen took the chair in the absence of the president. Henry, the son of Rev. H. G. Klein, was admitted. His father promised to pay \$50 a year to cover some expenses. Expenses to attend the academy included the washing and mending of the bedclothes.

Art. 1.

The president Pres. J. v. d. Meulen
being absent, the Pres. Ch. v. d. Veent was
nominated to take the chair, for the day.
Art. 2

The Minutes of the former meeting
were read and approved. Art. 9 was amended
as follows:

Art 3.

Two boys, Anthony Benjaminsen and Pieter Doornheim, recommended by the Consistory of Leekland, were taken up on the Funds of the Board.

Art 4.

The case of Henry G. Klein was considered. Pres. Phelps and Ogden reported that \$50.00 was promised to be paid annually by his father, the Pres. H. G. Klein. ^{also that} The Classis of Michigan had resolved to take a collection for him. Whereupon it was resolved to keep him on the funds of the Board till Spring meeting, when the School Committee of Wisconsin will be present, ~~and~~ a final decision of his case will be made. He himself should be informed that there is but little prospect of his being kept after that time on the funds of the Board.

Art 5.

After some discussion it was resolved

that washing and mending of the
bed clothes is to be reckoned as part of the
support of a Student who is sustained
by the Board.

Art. 6.

Considered the case of De Pree
who had ^{without leave} absented from the S. Academy
to teach a School. it was
resolved: That Students who are supported
by Classis, for no reason ^{whatever} may withdraw
from the course of study without
permission of the professors Board.

Art. 7.

Resolved to hold the Spring meeting
of the Board the next day evening at seven
o'clock, the day before the meeting of
Classis. The Board adjourned to that time.
The meeting was closed with prayer
by Rev. W. Phelps.
