**COMMON COUNCIL.**

City of Holland, June 5th 1878.  
The Common Council met in regular session  
and was called to order by Mayor Schaddelce.  
Aldermen Present: Spruietsma, Nye, De Vries,  
Butkau, Van der Veen, Kramer, Cropley and  
the Clerk.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read  
and approved.

**Presentation of Petitions and Accounts.**

A petition was presented from E. Van der  
Veen, requesting permission, to use that part of  
8th and River Street lying in front of lot 25,  
Block 27, for storing building materials.—  
Granted.

The Director of the Poor and the Committee  
on Poor reported presenting a special report, as  
was requested at the previous meeting of the  
council.—Accepted and placed on file.

The Committee on Poor reported presenting  
the Semi-Monthly report of the Director of the  
Poor and said committee, recommending aid for  
the support of the poor for the two weeks end-  
ing June 19th 1878. Amount recommended  
\$60 50 (this includes certain orders issued by  
the Director of the Poor and a member of the  
Committee previous to June 5th to the amount  
of \$3 25).

On motion of Ald. De Vries,  
Resolved, That said Semi-monthly report  
be approved and warrants be drawn on the City  
Treasurer, which motion prevailed by a majori-  
ty vote of all the Aldermen present concurring  
thereinly Yens and Nays, as follows:

Yens: Spruietsma, De Vries, Butkau, Van der  
Veen, Kramer, Hoogsteger and Cropley.  
Nays: Nye.—Yens 7, nays 1.

The Clerk reported the City Librarian had  
filed a receipt in his office, showing that he had
