The Consistory meeting of the First Reformed Church was well attended but little business was conducted due to the absence of the clerk. Persons present were Rev. Albertus C. Van Raalte, elders Broek, Hekhuis, Appeldoorn, Labots, and Jonker and deacons Wilterdink, Plugger, and Keppel.

Consistory Meeting of October 29, 1852

Present are Rev, A, C, van Raalte, president; Broek, Hekhuis, Appeldoorn, Labots, and Jonker, elders; Wilterdink, Plugger, Keppel, deacons.

ARTICLE 1 – The president opened the meeting with prayer.

ARTICLE 2 – The minutes of the consistory meeting of August 20 and the congregational meeting of August 26 were read and approved.

ARTICLE 3 – Due to the sickness of the clerk, no minutes were recorded for the two immediately following meetings. However, the assembly judged that it would be appropriate to place a minute in connection with Brother Reidsma.
