Fulton, Illinois

Rev. Albertus C. Van Raalte preached in the Reformed Church of Fulton, Illinois.

Notes from the minutes of the Holland Reformed Church of Fulton City, Illinois, a congregation founded 28 October 1866 by Rev. Hendrik G. Klijn.

Minutes of the ~~Dutch~~ Reformed Church of Fulton
City, Illinois, founded on October 28, 1866 by
P. H. G. Klein and elder G. Fastenhard. On that
day, elders F. Sterenberg and G. Nannega and
deacon J. Zeelma were ordained.

On February 22, 1867, Rev. P. Lepeltak was in
our midst to preach, serve communion and
baptize the children.

In Sept. 1, 1867, Rev. J. H. Farsten preached for us,
served communion and baptized the children.

In Sept. 29, 1867, Rev. A. C. Van Raalte^{*} came and
preached for us.

In Oct. 27, 1867, Rev. P. Lepeltak preached for us.

In Dec. 15, 1867, Rev. P. Lepeltak was in our
midst, dedicated our Church, installed elders
and deacons, served communion and baptized
the children.

Elder F. Sterenberg was reelected, Jakob Sikkema
was elected as elder and F. Dykema was
elected as deacon.

Art. 1.
In July 5, 1868, Rev. R. de Beer preached for us
and as counselor, was active in our calling
of Pastor.

Art. 2.

After the ballots were distributed and the votes
counted, Rev. R. de Beer was unanimously
elected to become Shepherd and Pastor.
